hurt us during the recent unsuccessful bid for a muchneeded new city and county jail. I think its time to develop a long-term strategy for planning for these types of facilities.

Long Houses

The Land Use and Transportation Plan is moving forward. At our last meeting the INC membership voted to approve the Plan as it moves now to the Denver Planning Board for review. Of course, our approval is not without conditions, and we have included 19 specific concerns about the Plan in its current form. Many of the concerns are due to a lack of clear strategies for implementation and a need to establish benchmarks with which to measure the success of the plan. We are told that these will be addressed in the long-awaited appendices and I will encourage my colleagues at the Planning Board to review the appendices carefully before recommending approval of the plan. Certainly we must review a complete plan prior to making a recommendation.

Another concern addressed in the INC position is the lack of attention in the Plan to developing a process for planning and siting new community facilities, as required by the Comprehensive Plan. What better place to tackle this difficult issue than in the Land Use and Transportation Plan? In fact, according to strategy 1-A in the Land Use section of the Comp Plan, community facilities planning is specifically required to be considered in the Land Use and Transportation Plan. In my opinion, we ducked this issue when we wrote the Comp Plan and it has already come back to

On another zoning and growth-related issue, I was recently contacted by Steve Turner with the Community Planning and Development Agency, who was assembling a committee to review the issue of long houses in our older, established neighborhoods. For those of you unfamiliar with the terminology, long houses should really be called "big" houses: those large new homes or old homes with enormous additions that pop up in the middle of a block of bungalows or other modest Denver homes. Usually they are followed by structures of the same ilk. I was pleased to hear of the effort, because I believe it shows a real commitment by Planning to continue to seek ways to address neighborhood character issues.

Two INC representatives have been placed on the Long House Committee: Ann Morgan and Lynn Pressnall. Both are from the East Washington Park neighborhood. While it might have been more ideal to have representatives from two different neighborhoods, both Lynn and Ann are familiar with "quick wins" and other zoning issues, and both are eager to find solutions to a problem that plagues their neighborhood as much as any other in the city. I'd like to thank both Lynn and Ann for volunteering their time and energy. I know they will be productive members of the committee and keep the rest of us informed.

Denver Parks Makes Informative Presentation At November Meeting

Recycle that Tree!

Denver Recycles' annual Treecycle program will recycle thousands of Christmas trees into mulch again this holiday season.

All Denver residents whose trash is collected by Denver Public Works/Solid Waste Management may participate. This year, Christmas trees will be collected during a two-week period between December 1st and January 11th.

To Treecycle, remove all decorations, tinsel, nails, stands and bags from your tree and set it out for collection as follows. Flocked trees cannot be recycled.

Trash can and Barrel Customers: Set your tree about 4 feet away from your trash container by 7 a.m. on your trash day during either the week of December 31st or the week of January 7th. Call 720-865-6805 if your tree has not been picked up by 3 p.m. on your trash day during the week of January 7th. Remember, January 1st is a holiday and service will be delayed by one day for the remainder of that week.

Dumpster customers: Please set out your tree by 7 a.m., Saturday, January 12th just behind your property on the edge of the alley (not next to the dumpster, please.) Trees will be collected one day only from dumpster areas.

Dollar Dictionary Drive Raises Enough to Pay For This Year's Dictionaries


