Are you interested in getting your neighborhood prepared for emergencies? Whether what we face is environmental—flooding, disease, windstorm, snowstorm, hail, earthquake, fire, sinkhole, or if its manmade—domestic and international terrorism, active shooter incidents, hazardous material spills—it's important for you and your neighbors to be prepared. Statistics show that 95% of the time the first responders to an emergency are the people you know!

The City and Count of Denver Office of Emergency Management is proud to announce a four-part training series to get your neighborhood group to be a certificate-holding Resilient Neighborhood Response Team!

Step 1: Determine a neighborhood boundary of 15-20 homes or apartments. This is the ideal number because it's easy to assess in under an hour

Step 2: Gather people within the neighborhood boundary interested in participating in readying your neighborhood for emergencies by leaving invitations to join the new team (we have them available for free for you to print, or we can also drop them off to you!)

Step 3: Contact Denver Office of Emergency Management to schedule your first meeting

Step 4: Host an in person or virtual meeting!
