There is detailed research and information on how low density sprawl results in an increase in transportation-related pollution - which is a large sector among the various sources of air pollution. (Note: Between 2000 and 2020 the metro region has nearly doubled urbanized land overall.) Lower density development at the urban edge has more and longer driving trips. In denser urban districts opportunities for alternatives to driving - as well as shorter trip making - can be beneficial in reducing transportation-related pollution.

10:36:37 From Esther Sullivan : That is an excellent explanation Rocky. Many people think the opposite - that urban density might increase air pollution, but research demonstrates the opposite: lack of density, especially sprawl, contributes to transportation related pollution (a major air quality concern) because people are using cars more and traveling longer distances.

Currently, CO "enables" local planning - many other states have specific requirements for what local planning addresses. Please note: CO is now looking at revising planning statutes to require local jurisdictions to address housing and land use. See draft Senate Bill 23-213. While "climate" is mentioned in the draft bill's intent - more could be incorporated to require health impact assessment, climate impact assessment, and equity impact assessment. The initial language focuses on fiscal assessment.
